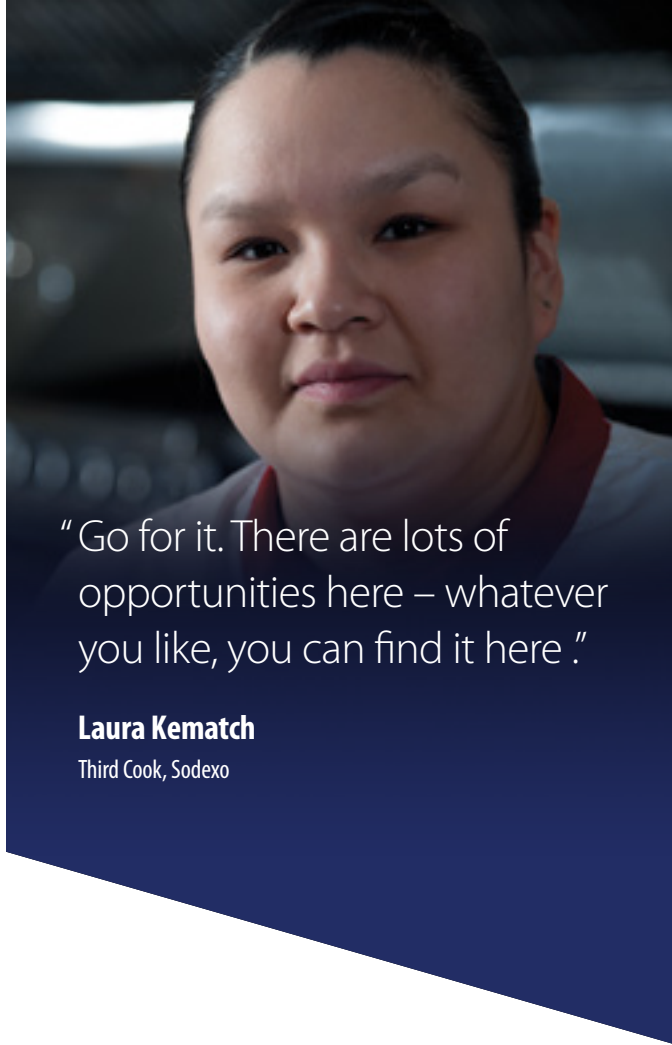
About KEEYASK

The Keeyask Project is a 695 megawatt (MW) hydroelectric generating station, being developed in partnership between Manitoba Hydro and four Manitoba First Nations – Tataskweyak Cree Nation, War Lake First Nation, York Factory First Nation, and Fox Lake Cree Nation. Working together, the partners are known collectively as the Keeyask Hydropower Limited Partnership (KHLP).

Located on the lower Nelson River, approximately 725 kilometres north of Winnipeg, construction of the Keeyask Project includes:

- **A powerhouse containing seven turbine generators;**
- **A spillway stretching across the South side of Gull Rapids;**
- **Dams across Gull Rapids; and**
- **Dykes on the north and south sides of the reservoir.**

Once completed, Keeyask will provide renewable energy to fuel our province's future.

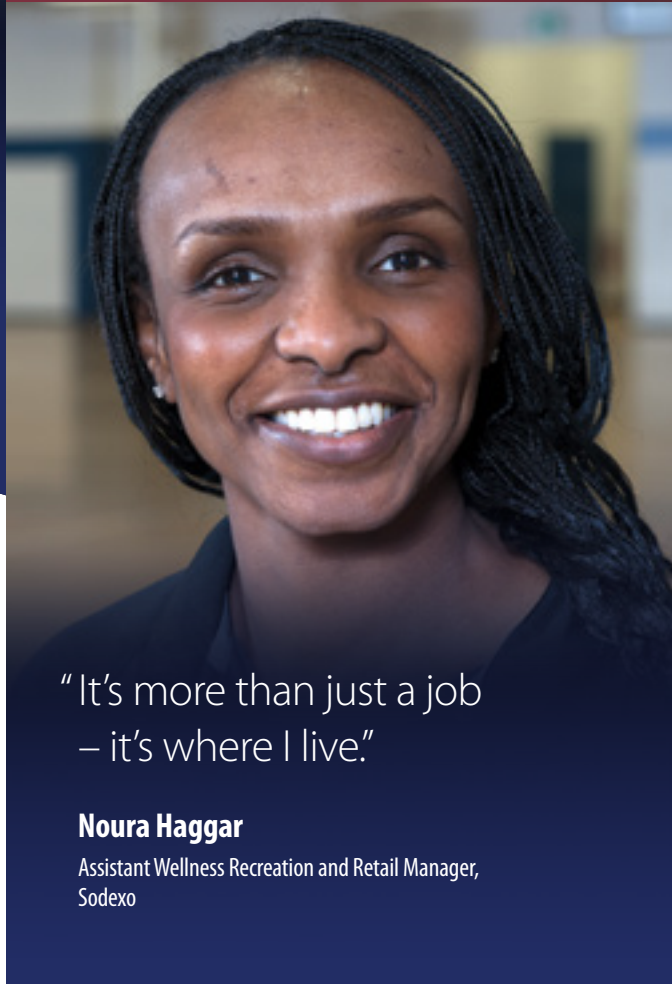

To build KEEYASK
