

KEYYASK PROJECT NOTICE

STAY SAFE: Conditions on the Nelson River from Clark Lake outlet to the Keeyask Project site have changed.

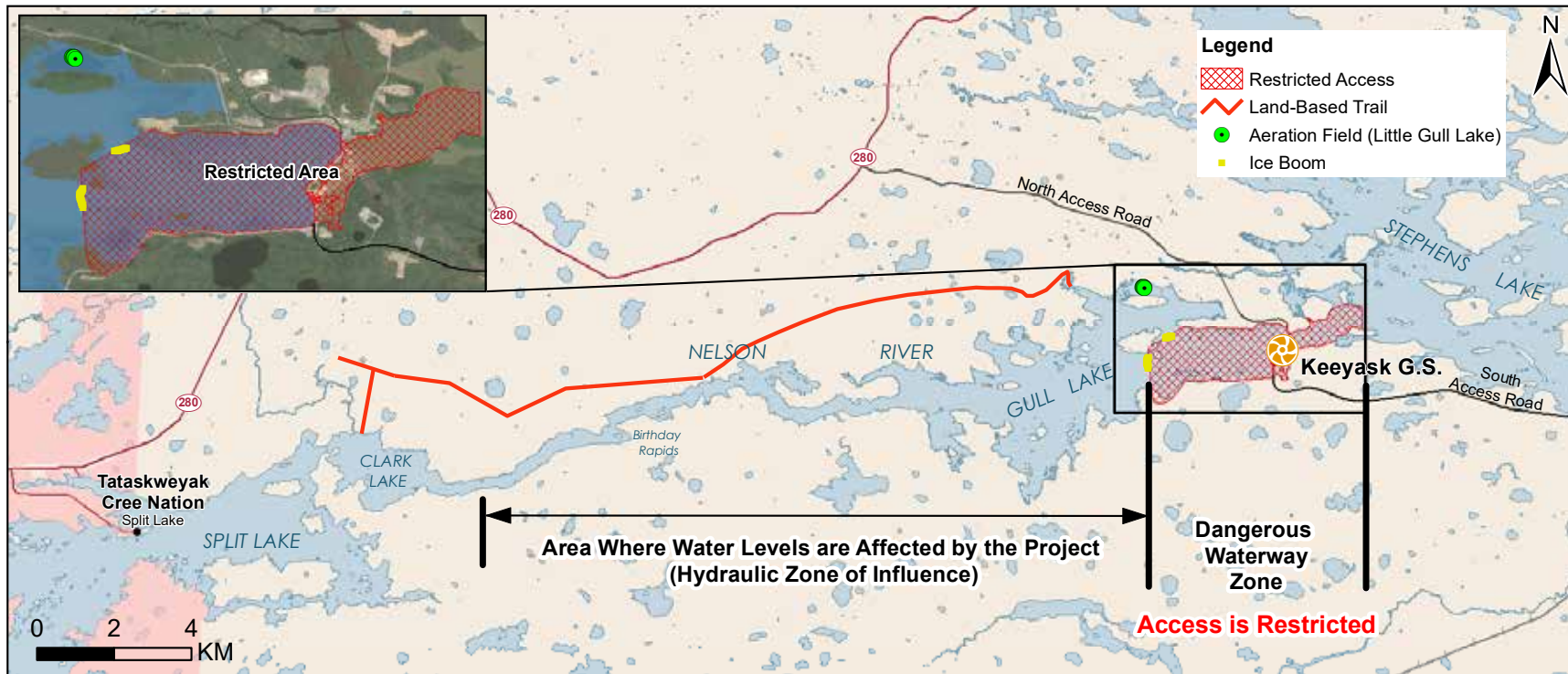


Please travel with caution.

During the 2020-21 winter season, a land-based trail will be installed from Clark Lake to Gull Lake on the north side of the Nelson River. No safe ice trails will be installed on Gull Lake this season. Trails will be installed on Gull Lake once the construction of Keeyask is complete.

Please watch for safety markers and avoid areas where access is restricted. Caution is advised in the former Little Gull Lake area where an aeration system is being used to protect fish from the risk of winterkill. Open water and thin ice will be present.

Keeyask reservoir impoundment was completed in September. The impounded reservoir now extends approximately 42 kilometres from the Keeyask Generating Station to about 3 kilometres (2 miles) downstream of the outlet of Clark Lake with changes to water levels and flows. A debris management program was implemented in the fall of 2020 and will resume during the 2021 open water season.
